The State council has sent me literature about the 2010 Soccer Challenge. I would like to hear from anyone who is interested in participating in this challenge at the council

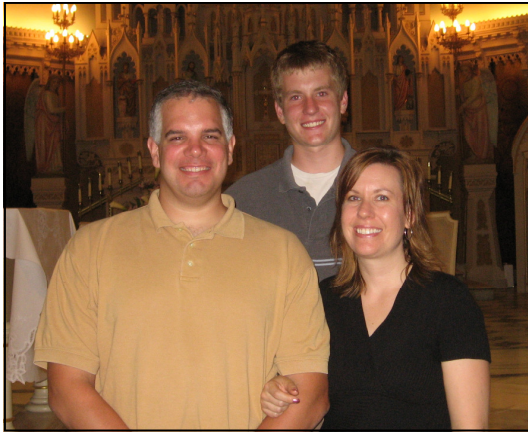
